Gifts of Land

You can support the charitable causes/ organizations that are important to you by donating land to the Community Foundation.

A gift of land to charity provides benefits

- Avoid capital gains taxes (when applicable)
- Deduct the full fair market value of the property-assuming it qualifies as long-term appreciated property, it has no mortgage debt against it, and you are not in the business of buying and selling real estate.

Important considerations in planned gifts of land
A gift of real estate requires special
considerations. For us to accept real estate as a
gift, the property must be saleable or suitable for
our use. Here are some benchmark considerations
associated with real estate gifts.

Professional Appraisal:

The IRS requires an appraisal from a qualified appraiser to substantiate the value of property claimed as the basis for a charitable deduction over \$5,000.

Environmental Review:

A gift of commercial real estate often requires at least a preliminary environmental review to ensure that the property is not subject to contamination.

The Community Foundation has been honored to receive gifts in the form of property. CFHC will take steps to ensure the good stewardship of the land for generations to come.

Gifts of Grain

You can support the charitable causes or organizations that are important to you by donating part of your harvest to the Community Foundation.

As a donor, you must follow certain steps to ensure that the ownership of the gifted grain is transferred to the Community Foundation before it is sold. Otherwise, the IRS may treat your gift like a cash contribution, causing you to lose the intended tax benefits of the gift. These steps are:

- Contact us by phone 317.462.8870 or email info@CelebrateHancock.org and let us know the name of the grain facility you wish to use.
 We will provide the facility with the appropriate notification and answer any questions about the transaction.
- Complete the form on the reverse side. Make two copies, one for your records and one to take to the facility when you deliver the grain for the gift. Mail the original form to the Community Foundation of Hancock County.
- Deliver the grain to the facility with the completed form, which establishes that ownership of the grain will be transferred from you to CFHC. Remind the facility to issue payment to the existing Community Foundation of Hancock County account.

Please be sure to consult with your accountant before making gifts.

How It Works

Donating a gift of grain to the Community
Foundation is a simple way to make a lasting
difference. The value of the grain can be used to
start an endowed fund in the name of your family,
to benefit a specific nonprofit organization
important to you, or to support charitable causes in
Hancock County as they change over time. There
are some specific steps to take that will help ensure
you receive intended tax benefits from a gift of
grain.
