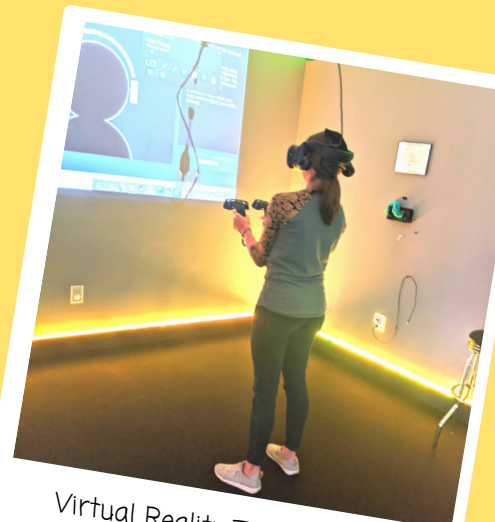

During a Pandemic

One of the things I love most about the work of HCCF is that each day brings challenging work. That said, 2020 afforded us uniquely challenging opportunities that exceeded even my expectations!

In response to the pandemic, HCCF quickly pivoted the assets earmarked for a competitive grant cycle to establish a new fund...one that would allow us to quickly mobilize resources to address the pressing needs of nonprofits. The fund was branded Heart for Hancock: A Community Relief Fund. The Board of Directors determined it was appropriate to grow the fund, seeded by HCCF's \$115,000, with a dedicated development effort. Our community responded by generously donating more than \$200,000. Grants made from the fund thus far can be found on Page 5. Thanks to our community's generosity, HCCF is prepared to continue COVID-19 related operating support to nonprofits well into 2021.

Together with a team of representatives from schools, businesses, and nonprofits, HCCF and Hancock Economic Development Council (HEDC) co-launched the COVID-19 Community Recovery Team. Zoom allowed the group of 40 community leaders to work together virtually. The Team identified critical conditions, prioritized actions, and deployed strategies that are contributing to Hancock County's recovery. These efforts include the exploration of a volunteer matching portal, creating a small business loan program, designing a virtual fundraising toolkit for nonprofits, and launching an effort to better connect employers with workforce-eligible high school students.

While 2020 demanded HCCF to address unique needs, the following pages provide assurance that your community foundation continued its reliable work in the areas of stewardship, financial soundness, educational attainment, nonprofit capacity building, and quality of life initiatives.

What a privilege it has been to serve HCCF as a board member since 2015. Many of these years of service were spent on the HCCF Grants Committee. That experience provided a unique and useful lens for 2020 as I found myself called upon to lead the Board through uncharted waters during a very challenging time for our community, country, and world.

Stay tuned for more details soon!

I am so proud to be part of the leadership team of HCCF. It is an honor to serve a nimble organization with such a deep reach into our community even, and

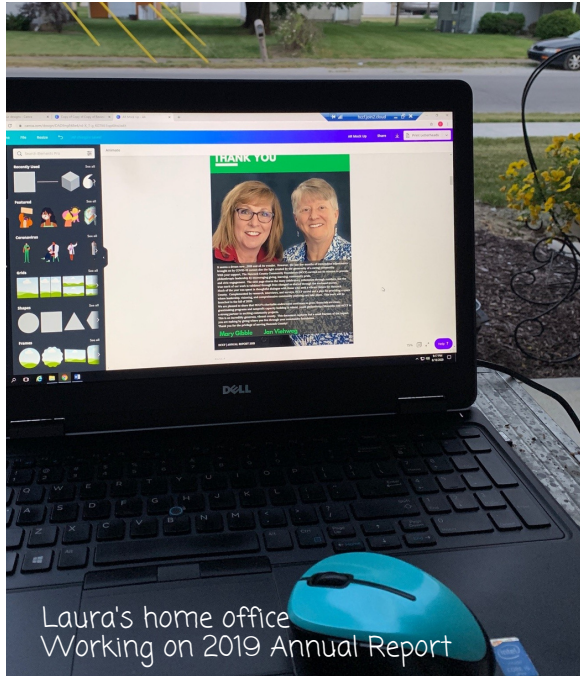
especially, during the tough times. I am grateful to all our supporters that responded so generously to the challenges of 2020. With your help, HCCF is poised to accomplish more important work ahead!

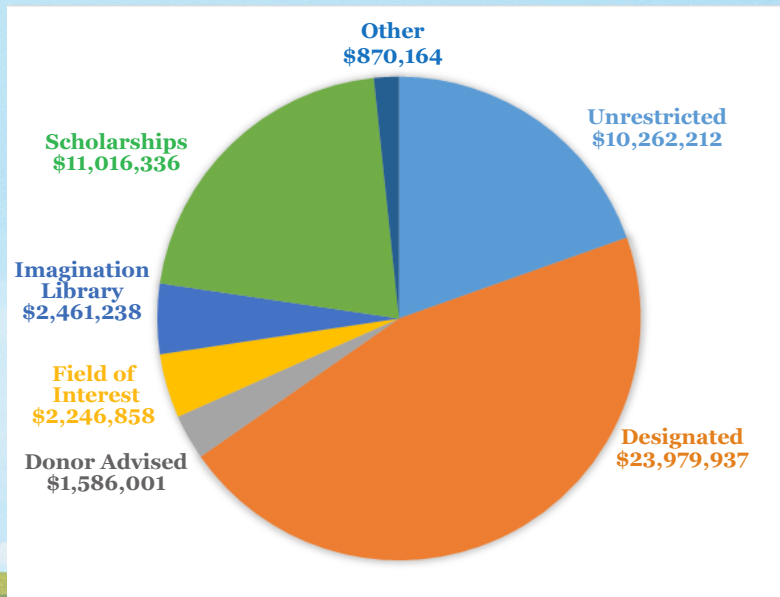

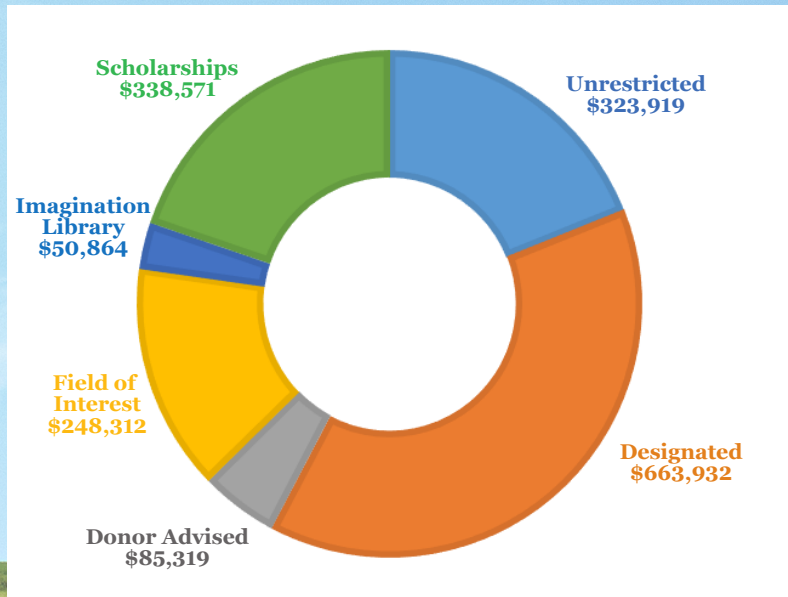

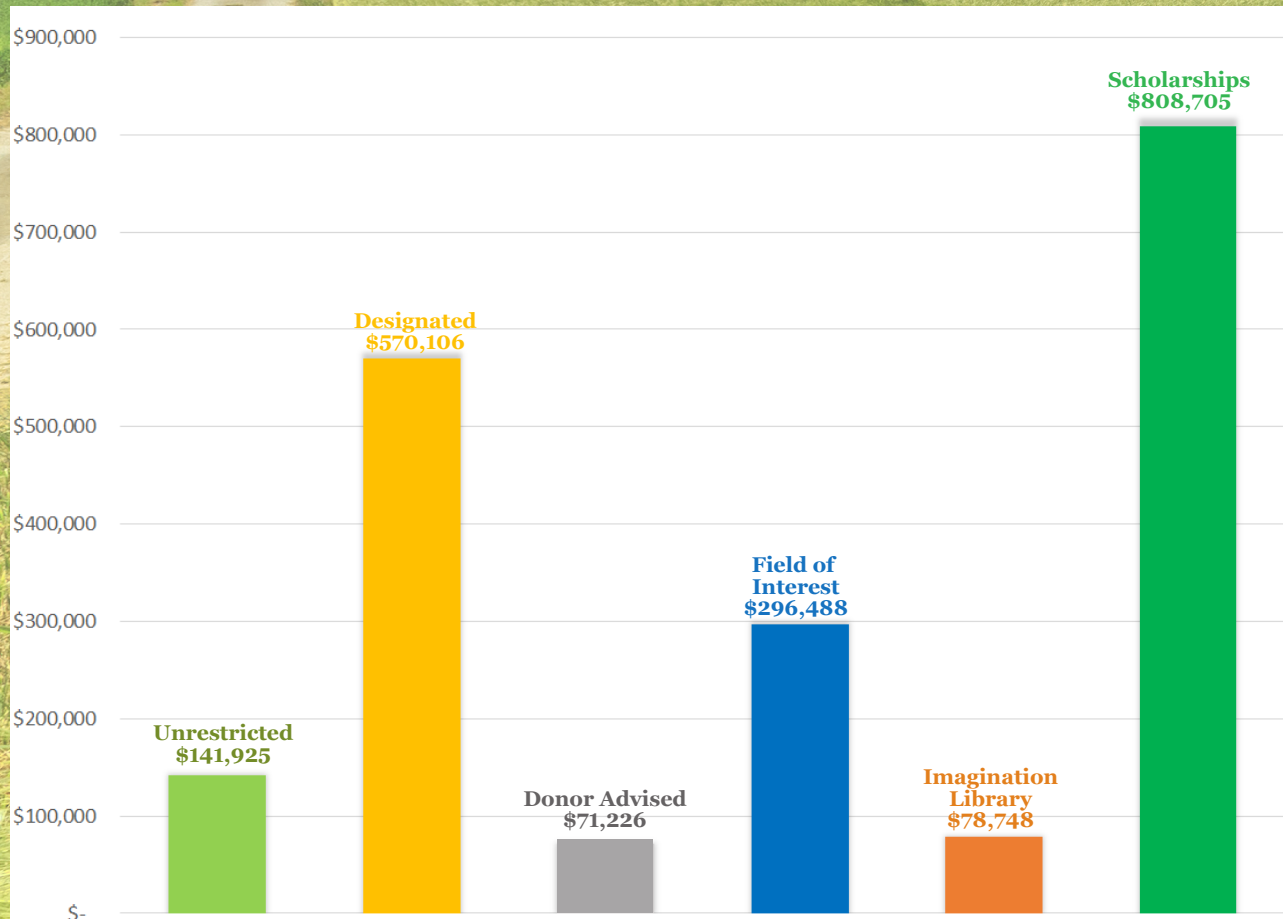
Funds by Type



Grants by Type



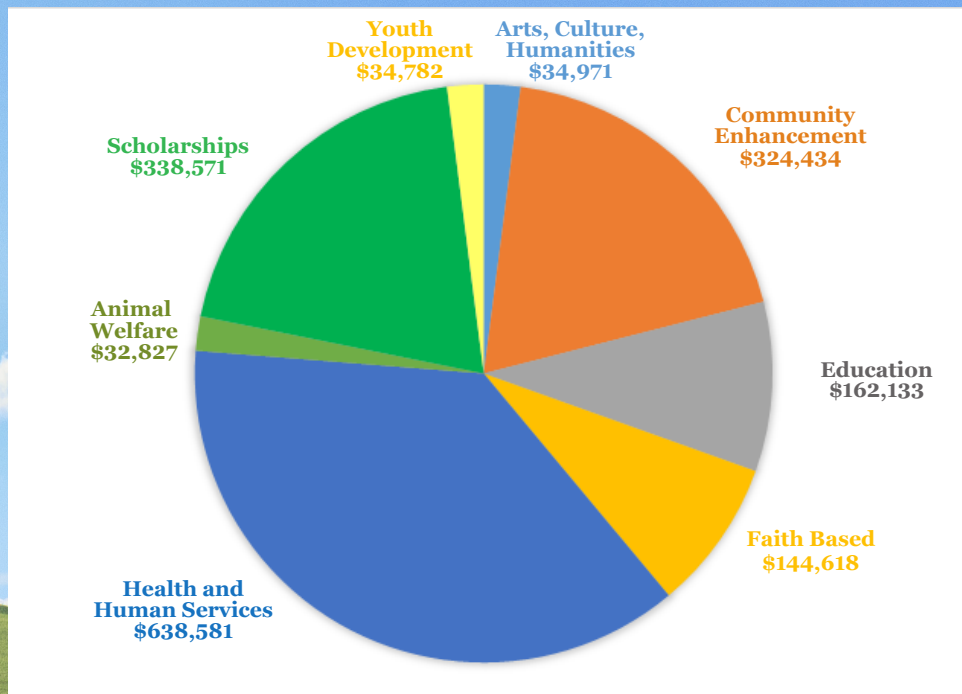
Gifts by Type



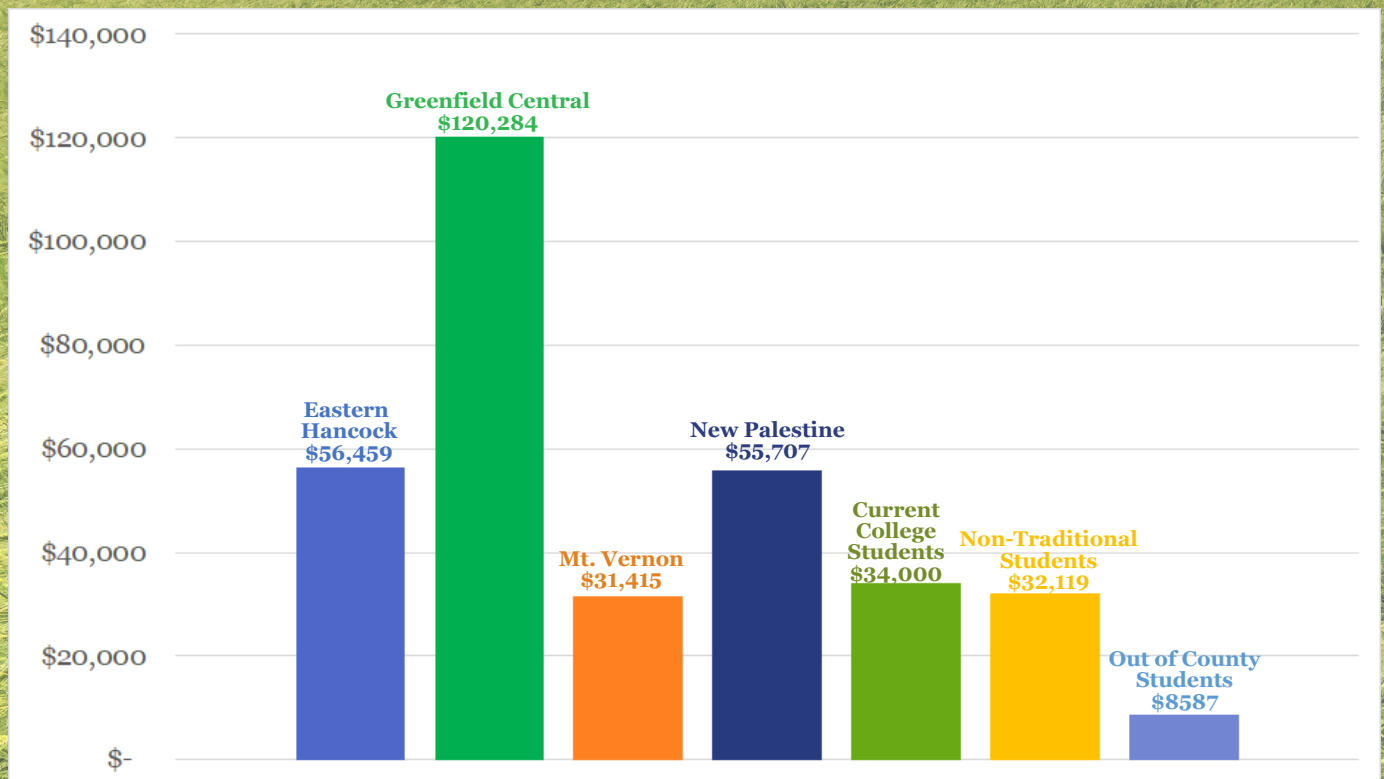

Donors Ensure Sustainability for Heartfelt Charities

A designated fund names a charity or charities to benefit from the fund. A donor has the assurance of knowing that the charity or charities they choose – whether in Hancock County or elsewhere in the U.S. – will forever benefit from their support. In 2020, HCCF granted over \$500,000 to more than 100 organizations through designated funds.

This spring, HCCF hosted a virtual Community Plunge event to introduce donors to four nonprofits that received grants in 2020 from designated funds administered by HCCF. These organizations will continue to benefit from these growing funds each year in perpetuity to help them continue their important work.

St. Labre Indian School was established in 1884 in southeastern Montana to provide quality education that celebrates the Catholic faith and embraces Native American cultures to empower individuals and communities to attain self-sufficiency.

The ARC of Indiana has 43 chapters across the state, including Hancock County, that serve individuals with disabilities and their families. It was founded in 1956 by families seeking a more inclusive world for their children. At the state level, one focus for The ARC is advocacy. In the early months of COVID-19, several states made lists of “priority patients” to receive ventilators if there weren’t enough, and individuals with disabilities were at the bottom of those lists.

“We worked really hard to make sure Indiana never did that,” said Jill Vaught, The ARC chief development officer.

Mercy Ships is headquartered in Texas with ships located in west Africa that serve individuals in need of life-saving surgeries who have limited or no access to healthcare.

The Children’s Bureau was founded in 1835 to create healthier communities by strengthening families. They serve the entire state and also operate an office in Greenfield.

Grants that support staffing and general operations are often the greatest need for nonprofits to sustain their services, and designated funds provide this critical funding source.

“It can be difficult to recruit talented teachers to come out to rural America, so teacher salaries are a big expense for us,” said Rachel Earl, St. Labre Chief Development Officer. “It takes people to make the services happen.”



Excellence Academy

Builds Key Partnerships

In 2018, HCCF launched its Partners in Excellence initiative with the goal of uniting with charitable organizations serving Hancock County to grow together for a stronger community. While only a couple years in before the pandemic hit, the collaborations and achievements that blossomed from this work have made an incalculable difference in our community's continued recovery.

Meals on Wheels of Hancock County is a participant in the inaugural Excellence Academy, a three-year program that provides an educational deep-dive into core capacity-building topics. The five participating organizations come together quarterly to learn together and share experiences.

When COVID-19 emerged, our sessions moved to a virtual format, but that did not dampen the flourishing relationships among the "Owls" (our fun name for the participants, an acronym for Outstanding Wise Leader).

While Meals on Wheels met the call of a tremendous increase in demand for hot meal delivery, they also created the new Care Box initiative to deliver shelf-stable groceries, fresh produce, and eggs to clients. The Boys and Girls Clubs of Hancock County, a fellow "Owl," provided their facility and additional volunteer labor to pack grocery boxes for Meals on Wheels clients so they wouldn't have to go shopping and compromise their health. The Hancock County Food Pantry and Hoosier Harvest Market also supported the initiative.

"Thanks to the groundwork laid by HCCF through the Excellence Academy, the existing connectedness helped us quickly adapt to tackle an immediate need in our community," comments Lynda Kosh, Meals on Wheels Executive Director. "We were able to effectively collaborate with the Boys and Girls Club and other food providers utilizing our existing volunteer delivery structure to provide groceries without reinventing the wheel."

Like Meals on Wheels, at the outset of the pandemic, all of our county's food providers were inundated with increased need from residents directly affected by the virus and its ripple effects. HCCF began facilitating a bi-monthly Zoom call with food agencies to foster idea-sharing and collaboration. When Meals on Wheels exceeded Hancock Regional Hospital's capacity for meal packing, the Kenneth Butler Memorial Soup Kitchen stepped up to provide food, packaging, and volunteers to ensure no one in need missed out on nutritional and diet-specific meals.

Opportunities Abound

for Hancock County Communities

HCCF's initiative called Celebrating Communities began in 2013. It was born from a desire of community planners, managers, parks, chambers, and main streets to create energy through the sharing of ideas and resources. It continues today as a collaboration between representatives from the county, the City of Greenfield, and the towns of New Palestine, Cumberland, McCordsville, Fortville, Shirley, Wilkinson, and Charlottesville. Achievements of this endeavor include HCCF's county-wide grant support of community building upgrades, park amenities, festivals, unified school signage, a comprehensive trails plan, planning processes, and the Office of Community and Rural Affairs (OCRA) Stellar Communities.

"Before HCCF launched Celebrating Communities, McCordsville felt that we were too small to matter to others in the county," shares Tonya Galbraith, McCordsville Town Manager. "HCCF brings us together to share ideas and move forward with projects. HCCF does a good job of uniting the communities with an autonomy that is welcome."

Andy Ebbert, leader of Shirley Community Visionaries, shared that the pandemic has not stalled an effort to bring a one-mile trail and ballpark amenities to the Town. Funding is made possible through OCRA's Health & Heritage Stellar Communities designation, a regional partnership with the City of Greenfield and Town of Fortville.

"Without HCCF this project would not have happened," Andy states. "Nobody used to talk together, but Celebrating Communities changed all that. Our joint work on the Hancock County Trails Plan in 2018 deepened relationships and truly created a path for us to participate in the Stellar program. HCCF is a central guide for our county as a whole. They bring us together to share ideas and explore opportunities so that we can all excel."

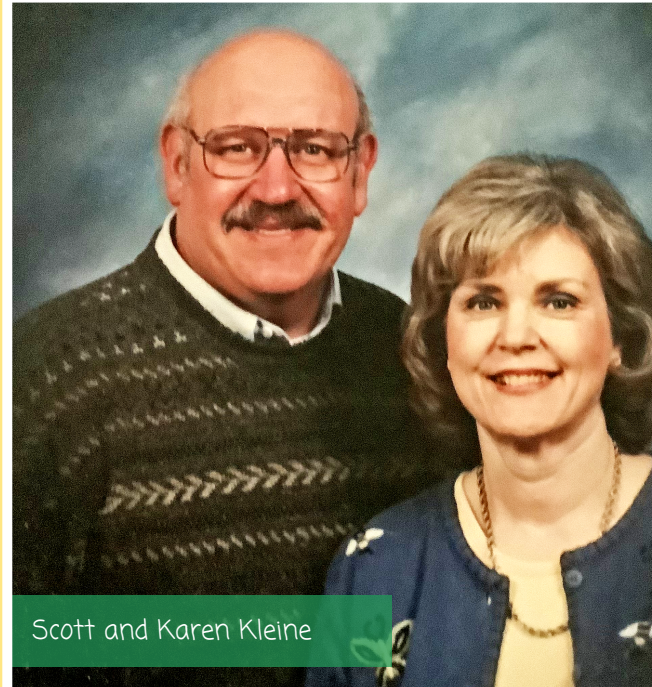

Supporting Education Partners in Trying Times


The year 2020 was anything but ordinary, but in many ways it was extremely extraordinary in the way our community pulled together to support one another during the COVID-19 pandemic.

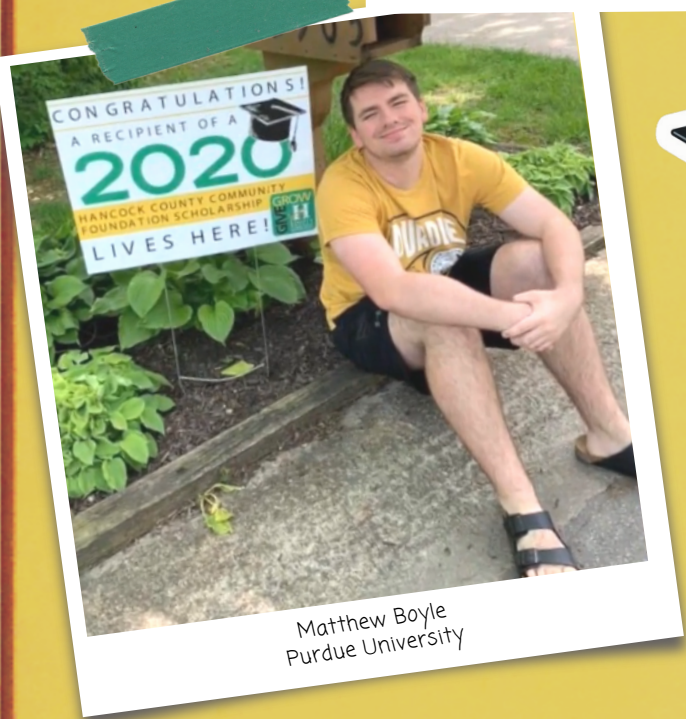

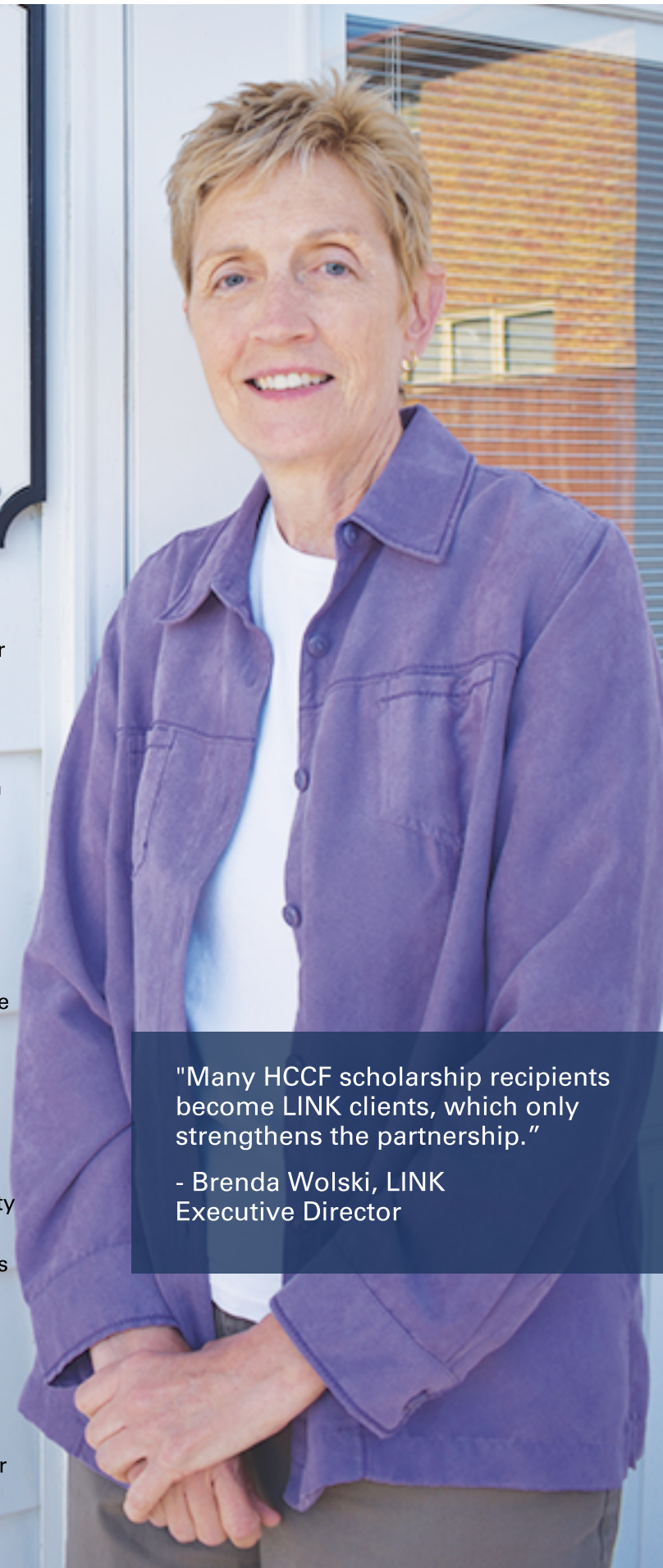

Meeting Adult Student Needs Virtually



Leaders in Navigating Knowledge, also known as LINK, is an organization that provides support to individuals in Hancock County so that they can successfully plan, prepare, and pay for education through and beyond high school. Brenda Wolski is the Executive Director.

Although LINK provides support to all age groups, the target audience for client support is the student that has had a gap in their education from high school, also known as a non-traditional student. The COVID-19 guidelines presented challenges for seeing clients in our office, but we were only a phone call away. "Our clients needed us during the pandemic as this was a great time to take an online class and explore changing careers," shared Brenda. "LINK also has a small budget to offer client assistance, which allows the client to take classes or purchase required books and equipment that they may not have been able to afford without our help."

"LINK has a tremendous partnership with the Hancock County Community Foundation. HCCF Education Officer Janet White and I work together by interviewing applicants that have applied for non-traditional scholarships through the community foundation," shares Brenda. Although we prefer to have interviews in person, we were still able to arrange scholarships for 11 clients and conducted phone interviews after mid-March."

Serving the community and the non-traditional population is important work. Many of LINK's clients are parents who want to provide a better life for their families. A career change may be necessary. LINK is proud to be able to help them reach their goals.
