The 2023 Annual Grant Cycle granted

more than \$140,000 to 26 organizations from a collection of CFHC's unrestricted resources and field of interest funds.

Community Development funds together create the pool of unrestricted dollars that CFHC leverages to meet community needs. CFHC funds projects that best meet the community's most pressing needs, even when those needs change over time. By making a gift or bequest to create a Community Development fund, a donor can create a living legacy that will evolve as the community does.

Field of Interest funds allow donors to address a cause or issue of importance to them without being locked into naming specific charities. The donor names the purpose of the fund, such as arts, animal welfare, environment, or youth. CFHC identifies projects that can most effectively accomplish that goal at any given time.

A recent grant to the Town of McCordsville

will ignite the new town center currently under construction... literally!

A \$25,000 Ignite grant will fund amenities that will be focal points for visitors and residents of McCord Square. The Trailhead will feature a bubbling boulder water feature in addition to a drinking/pet fountain. A second bubbling boulder will go on the north side of Main Street, creating a seating area along the sidewalk. Finally, a fire boulder will provide light and warmth in the park by the pond.

The first phase of McCord Square is expected to open to the public in Summer 2024; the amenities funded by the Ignite grant will all be accessible to the public by the end of 2024.

The Ignite grant program engages Hancock County's municipalities and civic organizations in a placemaking grant process. Grants support community-driven projects and quick-win transformations that foster connection

to place, enhance community vibrancy, advance physical and social outcomes, and promote a creative identity. If you are interested in supporting more of these projects in Hancock County, please consider donating to our Ignite Fund.
